BUSINESSES RE-OPENING AFTER LOCKDOWN

Businesses are beginning to re-open after the lockdown. Here are some changes that businesses have had to adapt as the new normal. Always check before you visit.

Animal Rescue and Shelters:

Rescues and shelters are now allowed to start re-homing and fostering animals. There will be new ways of meeting for humans and animals.

Boarding Homes & kennels:

Boarding Homes & Kennels may restrict the number of humans visiting at one time and have much stricter drop off and collection rules. There may even be a process of refusing to accept toys or blankets. Even changing to a kennel collar and lead or having your collar and lead cleaned thoroughly in soapy water.

Any animals that are admitted for care due to their human being ill or suspected of being ill will have to go through a period of isolation of three days. Where they will not be allowed to socialise with other animals and the staff will have to change PPE when handling them.

Day Care

Day care will have a new

appointment only arrival and leaving procedure where animals will be wiped down with a pet safe damp cloth that is used on only one dog and then disposed of properly.

If animals are collected or received from infected or self isolating households, any animal must be collected and returned separately, unless they are from the same household. They will be kept in a separate area at the day care.

DOG TRAINERS:

Dog trainers can work if they have access to secure areas and are able to maintain social distancing. They can provide their services and give advice or support via email, videos or by video link. Animals from infected or self isolating households should not be accepted unless via technology.

DOG WALKERS

Dogs from different households may be walked together as long as dogs from infected or self-isolating households are not mixed with non infected households.

Any equipment, including vehicles if used to transport the dog, must be cleaned and disinfected between dogs.

GROOMERS

Groomers can collect or receive clients via an appointment only system so that the groomer can control the number of animals and humans to ensure social distancing and cleaning down upon arrival.

Multiple dogs can be in the salon at the same time as long as there is 2 meters between them.

Any equipment, including vehicles if used to transport the dog, must be cleaned and disinfected between dogs.

PET SITTERS:

Pet sitters may operate if they can maintain social distancing rules and follow Government guidance on humans working in other people's homes. They should not sit for an infected or self-isolating household.

Veterinary practices:

Are still working with their video and phone consultations. With a controlled handover in the car park rather than humans being allowed inside the building.

Some have started to include more routine appointments rather than just emergency ones. Your vet will be able to advise what they are currently offering.

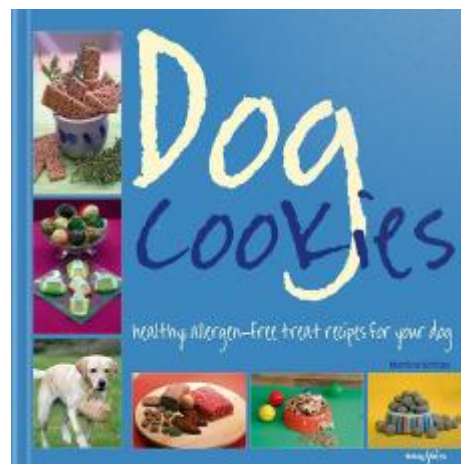

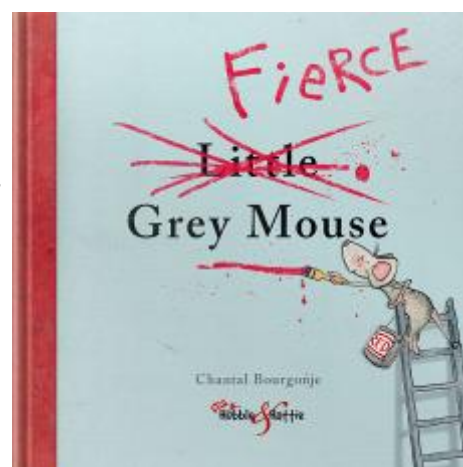
Fierce Grey Mouse

Mum has lots of strawberries from her allotment and we decided to use some in our recipe. It's okay we asked Mum before taking the strawberries! BOL! We all tried some of the finished bark and Mum and Dad said it is a palate cleanser, which I think means there is more for us!

Strawberry Yiggy-yoggy-you Bark**Ingredients:**

2 cups of chopped strawberries
2 cups of Greek yogurt
Berries to top

Method:

1. In a blender, blitz the strawberries until smooth. Add the yogurt and blitz with the strawberries until fully mixed.
2. Line a baking tray with baking parchment and pour mixture into the tray. Add topping berries.
3. Freeze for 6 hours until frozen solid. Cut or break the bark into pieces.

Storage:

Store in a container in the freezer.
Remove from the freezer 20 mins before eating.

TRAINING - POSSESSION WITH TOYS

Although I am covering my possession with toys in this article, sometimes resolving toy possession can help with possession with other things.

What is toy possession?

Toy possession is an extreme compulsion to grab and hold a toy or other object that can get that intense that you become aggressive due to your focus on the toy or object. Even to the point of growling or biting to get it.

It may not be restricted to a specific toy. It could be any toy or object. This could stem from being poorly trained or socialised at an early age. Where you never actually learned how to share or about give and take.

Sometimes toy possession is so intense that professional behaviourists are needed to reduce the obsession and some extreme cases, reducing injury to other animals or humans.

This is something that is important to get resolved as soon as possible there may be a time your human needs to get you drop something without question, regardless of what it is.

What can be done to reduce toy possession?

First of all, your human must feel they can try this technique without the fear of being nipped or harmed. If they do

not feel they can, they must seek professional behaviourist help.

Your human can start the process of reducing the obsession by 'swapping' the toy.

The first few times your human tries this, they should ensure your excitement level is kept as low as possible and as brief as possible.

Your human needs to get some toys and either stand, sit on a chair or sit on the floor (depending on how obsessed you are and what distance they need to work safely).

Note: If you immediately try to get all of the toys and show too much obsession, your human must stop the training session and either try again later or seek professional help.

They need to give or throw you a toy to start the training.

They then say 'give' or whatever training word they want to use. You of course will ignore them.

They then gently throw a second toy towards you a toy repeating 'give' at the same time. You should hopefully drop the toy you were holding and now have the new toy.

It is very important that your human does not try to retrieve the first toy you were holding.

Your human then gets a third toy and gives the 'give' command. Eventually you will get to the stage of dropping the toy you are holding as soon as you see the new toy.

It is normal to be surrounded by toys in the early training sessions.

This can be played as a game to try and create a relaxed atmosphere, but your human needs to remember that this is an important negative behaviour and they must remain vigilant until you no longer have a toy possession.

At the end of every training session you must be given a very tasty treat so that you associate the training as a good experience.

As the obsession gets reduced your human should try to get to the stage of touching the toy you are holding, and with the 'give' command, give you another toy to 'swap'.

The eventual goal is for your human to be able to ask you to drop something or be able to take something out of your mouth without any conflict or resistance.

Obsession with other animals around may take longer to train, so vigilance and further training sessions may be required.

TIGGER'S GREEN PAW - IN THE GARDEN

As with all plants, always check if you have any health problems that may be affected by growing any plants in your garden or yard.

Lavender

Animal Safety: Dogs: With Care Cats: With Care Rabbits: Yes
Free Grazing: In Moderation

Lifespan: Perennial

Sow: March to May

Flowers: July to September

Prune: August to September

Soil Type: Well drained soil

Position: Likes the full sun

Growth: Up to 24 " high, but could be less if grown in smaller pots.



Varieties: Over 47 varieties with colours from blue, lilac, purple to a very dark purple.

Growing information: Europe across to northern and eastern Africa, the Mediterranean, southwest Asia to southeast India. Lavenders flourish best in dry, well-drained, sandy or gravelly soils in full sun.

Some lavender can become leggy and get less flowers. This is usually due to not being pruned enough. Although remember not to prune into old wood as this can restrict growth too.

To rejuvenate a woody plant, prune in mid-August to just above a green shoot and hope for the best. If new shoots don't appear within the next month you might be better off starting again.

Lavender can cope in temperatures as low as minus 15 degrees centigrade, so can be left outside all year round, even in pots.

How to use:

Free grazing: In strict moderation

Rabbits can consume lavender, but due to the strong natural scent of lavender most rabbits will choose not to eat it.

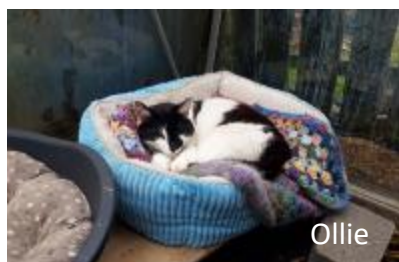
Dried: Can be use as room fresheners around the house. Also can act as a natural fly repellent. It is also used as a natural calming scent for both animals and humans. Even there is very little scientific facts about the calming nature of lavender, I can confirm I use it and it does calm me down.

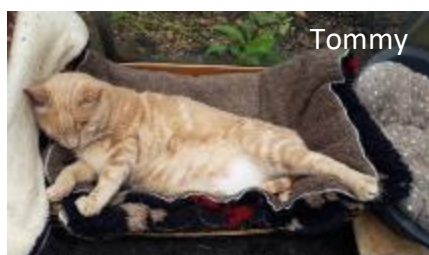
Most humans grow plants, or veggies in their greenhouses, but not my human - she is pretty good at growing cats! Yes, cats you heard right!

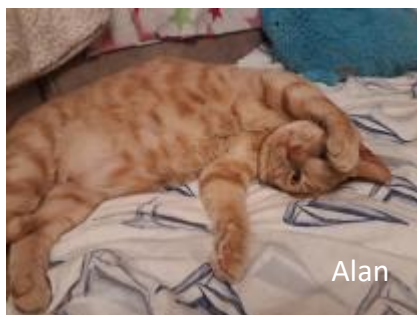

INTERVIEW WITH - CHERRY

Tell me a little bit about yourself.

I was adopted as an adult from Birmingham Dogs Home, sunnyside over 13 years ago which makes me 14 years old. Despite being companion to Candy Cavalier and Floss Irish Grey (non-racer), I was a "house-wrecker". I was so badly behaved, that my Mum would cry when she got home to see what damage I had done. After 9 months I was a complete angel!

My humans had a lot of patience with me. I don't like other dogs. I have been attacked several times.

How many siblings do you have and long have you had them?

Candy Cavalier KC was adopted as a breeders reject, but despite a bad heart, she lived until she was 14yrs (now over the rainbow). Floss. A fawn greyhound (but very small), was also from sunnyside; adopted when 507 yrs old (now over the rainbow), When floss passed, I became, at 7 years, a foster Mum to abandoned lurcher Bakewell (via Dogs Trust). When Candy passed, the humans adopted a huge black x-racing greyhound who was called peaches from RGT Wolverhampton.

I was scared of her at first, but she was the only one we thought was ok-ish? (we saw 9 over 2 days!)

Humans; we have Mum, Dad and two hoobrothers aged 23 and 24 yrs.

Do you work? If so where/ what do you do?

My first job was teaching Bakewell how to be a dog. I think I did a good job because I was a perfect role model, even though he grew almost twice as tall!

I am now at leisure, as i am going deaf and blind... I hover around my parents feet. We now have a 2 yr old lurcher from NGR, called Oreo. I hide from her by sticking my head under a cushion. She was adopted because I had liver disease, and no dog would play with Bakewell. My next liver test results were normal !!

If you could choose your name what would it be?

I.m fine with Cherry. I was highly athletic in my first 2 years. I could easily jump 6 ft high. I liked being high up to see what was going on, a bit like a Meerkat!

What is your favourite food?

I just love all food... theres nothing I won't havea go at eating. I had a sweet tooth. Once I had to go on a diet! I will eat frozen peas and carrots.

Where is your favourite place to be?

These days – at night by Mum's head or feet. By day on one of

the 2 sofas, a sofabed (Peaches), in front of the fire, or straddled on the back of the sofa. When I'm hot, I love splooting! I like walks, but hate other dogs.

What is your favourite way to entertain yourself (annoy your humans)?

To get a reward, I will lift a paw for you, or stand on my back legs (like a Meerkat). I will dig up a whole blanket into a ball to sleep on. I can still roll on my back with a toy in my paws and play. I expect to lick yoghurt lids, and pots (when empty). I get my Dad up for a wee in the night... usually when he's already been with the others when i was fast asleep!

What is your greatest accomplishment?

Firstly surviving. I know if my parents didn't give me a chance for 9 months to change my behaviour from house-wrecking, I fear I no-one else would have put up with me.

I cost them a lot of time and money. I once chewed up my hoobrother's Blackberry phone, I disconnected the landline phone, ate TV remotes, emptied the soil out of every plant pot in the living room, smashed plates, knocked everything off the kitchen work-surface.

It was my last chance to fit in.

INTERVIEW WITH - CHERRY (CONT.)

What is your next goal in life?

To stay healthy, and a loving to my family. I don't like Oreo much, but she cares about me, so I will try harder.

If you could be/do anything for a day, what would it be?

I would eat all day if I could; I am already and angel to my hoomans. I would love to have seen my old friends Candy and Floss again before they were put to sleep. I loved cuddling Candy – she was a fluffy hot water bottle; a warm cushion.

These sighthounds are all so bony, except for Peaches thighs! I would liked to have been taller.

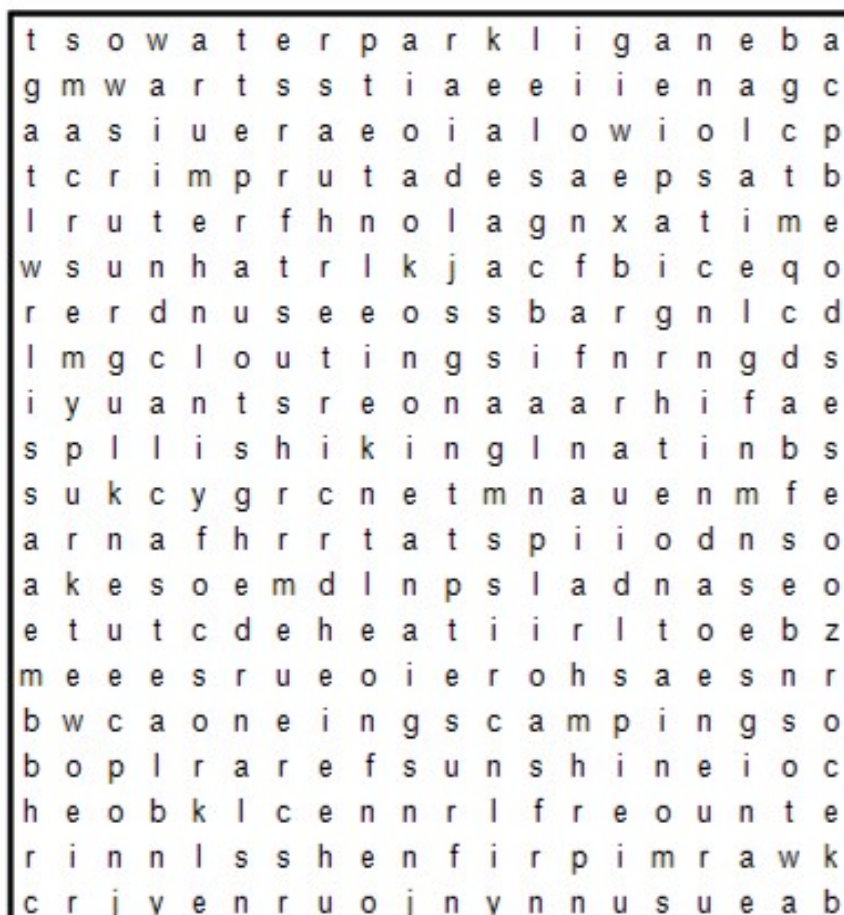
Finally and most importantly...What was your human's most embarrassing moment?

I first came across Skye Tails about a year ago on the Book of Faces and I begged mum and dad to order some treats for me, which thankfully they did, and when they arrived I was

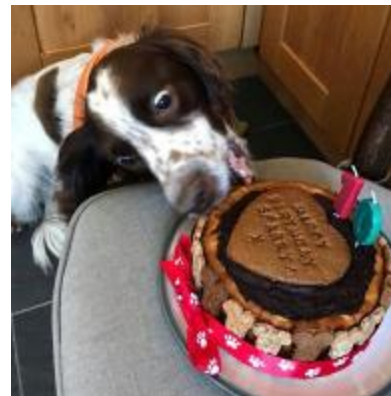

About:

In 1327 John Cockerham, Abbot of Furness, was granted a 'licence to crenellate' by Edward III, suggesting that he may have been fortifying an existing building.

At this time much of northern England was troubled by Scottish raids, and the monks of Furness wished to establish a place of safety.

They probably also wanted to monitor traffic passing through Piel Harbour on its way to their holdings in Ireland and the Isle of Man, and to protect cargoes from the weather, raiders and pirates.

Quarrels over trade (and charges of smuggling) meant that the monks were not always on the best of terms with the king.

On 4 June 1487 Lambert Simnel landed on Piel Island from Ireland, with an 8,000 strong army of mercenaries.

The son of an Oxford tradesman, he claimed to be the Earl of Warwick and thus rightful heir to the English throne.

He marched on London, but was defeated and captured at Newark by Henry VII and his forces.
