

### Rory & Harlow's Time Travelling Taxi - By Rob Willsher


The woman with the long red hair.

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### In the Kitchen

Mum gets a fruit and veg box from a local food co-op and they put little extras in, and one time we got sardines. Mum thanked them for the tins of sardines as we love them and they are good for my arthuritis. The lady then gave Mum their excess supply as no one really likes them.

Dad challenged us to come up with a recipe using at least one of the hundred (not exaggerating!) tins of sardines. Challenge accepted and won paws down, easy peasy sardine squeezy! BOL!

### **Sardines Three Ways**

Sardine Number 1 - Sardine Oatcakes (makes approx 36)

Ingredients: 2 tins of sardines in oil 250g oats 85g strong white bread flour 4 tbsp of water

#### Method:

1 Preheat oven to 180 and line two baking trays with baking parchment.

2 Mash the sardines, including the oil, then mix all the ingredients together into a dough.

3 Flour your work surface and roll the dough out into a 1.5 cm thick square or oblong shape (get a human to help hold the blunt side of a knife against the sides of the dough to help shape it).
4 Ask human to cut out square shapes using a sharp knife. Arrange the oatcakes on the baking trays.

5 Bake for 25 mins and remove from the oven. Leave to cool.

#### Storage:

Store in the fridge and will keep fresh for 5 days or freeze them.



Sardine Number 2 - Sardine Pate Ingredients: 1 tin of sardines 50g plain yoghurt Method: 1 Mix the sardines and the liquid from the tin with the yoghurt until well mixed.



2 Top the sardine oatcakes with the pate. **Storage:** 

Will keep in the fridge for 48 hours.

#### Sardine Number 3

- Au Natural Sardines Ingredients: 1 tin of sardines

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### Method:

1 Drain the liquid from the sardines and mash the sardines.

2 Top the sardine oatcakes with the au natural sardines.

## What have I learnt about my business?

I managed to get a small increase in sales and I met some pawsome new followers, website visitors, repawters and customers along the way, which was great as I know it takes time to build up a good customer base.

My business is definitely where I want to be full time. It gives me the creative freedom to do what I wanted to do when I first started, which is, to have my animal community website and newspaper which is By Animals For Animals. With some own brand products to sell. Plus I get to walk my human when I want.

I got a lot of experience.

I also had time to try some new ways of posting on social media and seeing what worked and what didn't.

### Have I been put off?

### What next?



The stone parapets that probably ran along either side of the central footpath and gave the structure extra strength have now disappeared.

Bow Bridge was built in the fifteenth century from the same plentiful supply of red sandstone and grey limestone as Furness Abbey, which dates back to the 1120s.

In its heyday Furness was the most powerful abbey in the North West and, at the time of the Dissolution of the

### Bow Bridge - Cumbria

Monasteries in the 1530s, the second richest Cistercian monastery in England. The surviving richly embellished arcades and the magnificently carved details bear witness to its wealth and importance.

Such a prosperous abbey cannot fail to have attracted merchants, traders and salesmen, as well as Scottish raiders.

During the medieval period, the traffic to and from Furness must have been fast and furious, with Bow Bridge carrying a steady stream of pedestrians and pack-horses laden with corn, malt, salt and other goods.

The bridge may have been constructed specifically to link the abbey with the nearby New Mill, but its position on one of the most important medieval trading routes in north-west England must surely be of even greater significance.
