ANIMAL THEFT IS ON THE INCREASE

There has always been a problem with animal theft and most of us are aware of it and take a lot of precautions to prevent it.

Due to the covid lockdown there has been an increased demand for puppies and kittens.

Ordinarily this would be potentially a great thing as there are plenty of reputable breeders and shelters out there, however due to lockdown, a lot of these places have been told to reduce or cease selling/adopting animals.

This has created a demand for animals from less reputable sources. This has the potential risk of money changing hands with unscrupulous humans who would think nothing of stealing animals to force them to breed

for puppies or kittens that they can then sell at greatly inflated prices to meet this new demand..

There are now reports that animals are being stolen off the streets and even from humans as they are being walked.

So when you are out and about please ensure your human does as much as possible to keep themselves and you safe.

Even though we have to socially distance, try to walk with family members or members in your bubble. Or walk in areas where a lot of others walk regularly, but keep a very safe distance.

Reduce off lead walks to secure areas or at home.

Whatever you do pals, ensure you keep safe and stay alert.

Rory & Harlow's Time Travelling Taxi



IN THE KITCHEN

As it has been very cold and icy recently we thought we would try a warm recipe, well our humans put the kettle on when they come back from our walks so why can't we get something warm! BOL! There is a lot of chopping so nose bump your humans to get help.

Chicken and Fennel Howl
(makes lots of servings!)

Ingredients:

4 chicken thighs (finely chopped)
600ml weak salt-free vegetable stock
1 Fennel bulb (halved, cored and finely chopped)
1 Celery stick (finely chopped)
1 Carrot (finely chopped)
1/2 tsp oil
1 tsp flour

Method:

1. Heat the oil in a large saucepan and add the fennel. Cook the fennel for 10 minutes until softened, stirring occasionally so it doesn't burn.
2. Add the carrot and celery and mix with the fennel, add the flour and stir to coat the vegetables.
3. Pour in the stock and bring to a simmer, then add the chicken. Cook for approx 15 minutes or until the chicken is cooked through.
4. You want a stew consistency so add flour if necessary, to thicken.
5. Leave to cool before eating (it mixes well with kibble).

Storage:

Will keep for two days in the fridge or portion and freeze.

increased urination (polyuria),
excessive drooling,
and weight loss.

If you have concerns that your dog may be showing symptoms of illness after eating any of the affected products, please contact your veterinarian.

PET BLOOD BANK UK - BECOME A DONOR



Launched in 2007, Pet Blood Bank UK is the only charity that provides a canine blood bank service for all veterinary practitioners across the UK.

Their products and services are available to all UK veterinary professionals 24 hours a day, 365 days a year ensuring that blood is accessible when it is needed most.

Just like people, sick and injured animals may need blood transfusions and in many cases, blood transfusions can save a pet's life.

Every one of their lifesaving

donors makes a huge difference.

With every unit of donated blood having the potential to help save the lives of up to four other dogs.

Venues around the UK have held pet blood donor sessions. Check Pet Blood Bank UK website to see if there are venues near you that hold regular blood donor sessions.

If there are no donation sessions near you, please still register your dog as Pet Blood Bank UK are gradually expanding their sessions across the UK.

They need a minimum of 60 dogs in an area to hold a session, so ask your friends to consider registering their dogs too.

There are minimum weight, size and health criteria that

animals need to pass before being considered as a donor. Contact Pet Blood Bank UK for their full guidance.

Never just turn up for a donor session, you need to have been registered and booked in beforehand,

Pet blood bank UK also hold blood donor sessions for cats and Alpacas. Even more reason to make sure you register and book in .

PRODUCT REVIEW - HAIRY RABBIT EAR TREAT



Product Review:

Hairy rabbit ear treat

Cost:

50p each

As well as eating these, I stock and sell them on my website.

Date Bought:

Regularly

Brief Description:

They are exactly as the name describes. Dried rabbit ears that still have the fur on.

They can range in size and colour

Uses:

They are used as a treat and given whole.

They are suitable for dogs and puppies over 12 weeks.

It is always best to give treats and any foodstuff with plenty of fresh drinking water available .

Along with being a healthy treat hairy rabbit ears are also known to be a natural wormer and good for helping to clean teeth.

A lot of humans have heard this but are not actually sure about the whole what and why.

So here is a brief description of how eating a hairy rabbit ear works.

In the mouth:

Crunching down and tearing at the treat will give teeth a bit of brushing and help scrape any plaque or prevent plaque from forming.

Although this will not replace proper daily teeth brushing.

- Think of a human flossing BOL!

On the way through the system:

The fur is not digested by the dog when it is consumed and is a great source of fibre.

Now fibre is another word humans hear and are not too sure about either.

Fibre is a foodstuff that passes through the digestive system while 'brushing' the surface of the intestines.

The other end:

Even after most food or treats are no longer useful, fibre has one last useful parting gift. It keeps poop firm as it passes through and helps to express anal glands naturally.




