
I showed my findings to Elaine who smiled and said I didn't have to go in the boot again and I could get a fancy leopard print hammock for the back seat. Bingo.





Dogs With Jobs—"Winston"

Tell me a bit about yourself:

I am a 4 year old Labernese (black labrador/Bernese mountain dog).

I've been a service dog for nearly 2 years now, but I was in school learning the job for a year before that. And my first year was spent with a foster family that socialized me and made sure to expose me to a wide range of environments and experiences to make sure I'd be happy and comfortable when working.

Why are you using an alias?

I am using an alias, not for any deep and mysterious reason. As a service dog I must be 100% focused on my job and the welfare of my human. Imagine if I was about to assist my human across a busy road and another human spotted me and shouted my real name. This would not only be distracting, it could be very dangerous for both myself and my human.

Do you enjoy being a service dog?

Absolutely; Not only do I get to spend all day every day hanging out with my human, I get to go to loads of places not normally open to your average dog.

He brings me to all kind of weird and wonderful places with new smells, new people. I get to help him and he rewards me with love and treats. People say I'm working, but really, I think it's a great game.

Are there any rules or special things we need to do/consider if we meet a service dog?

It sounds harsh, but you and your humans must not pet, talk or interact with me while I am working as I must be totally focused.

Do you get to have time to relax and play?

When I'm at home, I don't work. Or rather, I'm on call. I don't have to wear my work harness at home, and I can just crash where I want (usually I stay close to my human even if I don't have to).

We play games like running up and down the corridor between the entrance and the kitchen. I have toys (oooh boy, my stuffed turtle is my favourite! and I haven't managed to destroy it yet).

In summer, my human gives me a kong filled with canned food that he put in the freezer. That keeps me occupied and cool for a good hour! And 2 or 3 times a week, we go to the dog park where I can be off leash and sniff around and run like a wild thing.

Do you not get lonely not having a dog pal to play or meet up with?

Not at all as I have a human that is 100% focused on my health and welfare. Not only physically but also emotionally as I am never left alone and I receive plenty of cuddles and treats.

Every day is an adventure and I wouldn't change it for anything.

Have there been any funny moments while you have been a service dog?

As for funny moments, there are a few that jump to mind. Like the first time my tail swiped my human's tv remote control off the coffee table. I didn't even think, I JUMPED to go get it and gave it back to my human.

Or the time someone at the airport dropped their passport in front of my nose. I picked it up, gave it to my human, who handed it to the man who'd dropped it.

The man complained that his passport was a bit wet from saliva - but he laughed because he thought it was cool.

Or the time we came across another dog and their human. The man told the other dog to "get out of the way, he works for a living, unlike you, lazy lump".

I was contacted by Paracord leads North
East and asked if they send me a lead, would
I like to review it.

I of course was happy to review their lead.

Product Review:

Paracord Leads North East

Product(s) Received:

1 x paracord lead

Products Used:

Paracord Lead

Packaging:

Arrived in a plain Brown envelope.

NOTE: They are based in a town near me so hand delivered the lead.

Using the Product:

As a lead is attached to my harness I was not expecting any difference to myself, more for my human holding it.

Personal Observations:

- 1. Every time I slightly pulled away I felt a gentle pull back similar to the gentle corrective pull backs my human does when we are walking. So I ended up walking beside my human more.
- 2. My human said the lead felt lighter. (probably because I was walking beside them more)
- 3. I love the colour s chosen by the company as they match me quite well.
- 4. When I suddenly pulled sharply to one side (there was a tree that had to be sniffed) The lead has some flexibility so I wasn't jolted to a stop and my human was not pulled off balance.

Overall Product Rating:

I have only had it a few days but up to now I

am very happy with the lead. My human is happy to use it too.

Would I buy the product myself:

Yes I probably would, although as I now have one unless I wanted different a colour.

About the Company:

Paracord Leads North East specialise in Handmade Dog Leads.

These Leads are extremely versatile and can be used for show, agility, strength, work and everyday use. They are made from **550 Parachute Cord** and able to withstand up to 2000kg of weight in total. (Please don't try at home!)

Don't worry they won't hurt your hands! They are softer than normal rope and slightly stretchy...so your dog won't be taking you for a walk.

HEALTH - HYDROTHERAPY

I have often heard about hydrotherapy but know nothing about it, so I contacted Chesterfield Hydrotherapy Referral Centre in Derbyshire.

Tell me a bit about your company.

Chesterfield Hydrotherapy Referral Centre first opened in 2014 and had just 1 dog being treated a week.

Now we have about 20 plus each week.

I was started by myself and is the only one in Chesterfield. We have a 5m x 2.4m pool which is big enough for even Newfoundlands to swim in.

Is a hydrotherapy centre a fun swimming pool for animals? Yes it is for small animals, how-

ever so far we have only had dogs in it.

Although we did get asked to swim a pig and a cat. Cats sometimes enjoy swimming.

Or is it just for injury recovery?

We use hydrotherapy to treat dogs with injuries however, we also see dogs who just come because they like swimming and their humans want them to swim somewhere which is safe and clean.

We also see dogs whose humans what them to learn to swim or have more confidence in water.

What types of animals have been to your facility?

So far only dogs, however we could see cats, rabbits, or other small animals.

What is the benefits/reasons for animals using the facility?

That is not an easy question to answer in a few words. However, basically it uses the properties of water such as Buoyancy, Hydrostatic Pressure, Cohesiveness, Resistance, Viscosity and Turbulence.

Also because the water is warm it relaxes the muscles and increases circulation and promotes healing.

Hydrotherapy also improves dogs mental health particularly when they are injured and can no longer run and play. Because swimming is non weight bearing the dogs can play with balls in the water without any force going through their joints.

Hydrotherapy helps with conditions such as Arthritis, obesity, hip and elbow dyplasia, luxating patella, cranial cruciate disease, degenerative joint disease, CDRM, Wobblers, amputations, muscle tears, ligament injuries and pre and post operative conditioning to list a few.

What happens if an animal cannot swim?

Every animal that uses the pool will wear either a lifejacket or a

harness.

The lifejacket gives the animal confidence that they will not drown but float.

Also I am in the pool with the dog and will be helping them whenever they need it to make sure that they can enjoy swimming.

I believe that pretty much every dog can swim after a fashion albeit with a lot of thrashing around and this means the dog could get itself to the edge of the water.

The problem comes if they then can't get out.

At the centre we have a ramp where the dogs enter and leave the pool safely and they are guided to this from their first swim.

Do you have special life vests/ devices for animals?

Yes we have different sizes of lifejackets and harnesses as well as buster collars and ear wraps.

We also use arm bands for some dogs who need a bit more buoyancy.

If for recovery only, how to animals get to book in to your facility?

Every dog we see has to have a vet referral or agreement for them to be treated at the centre even if they re only coming for fun.

HEALTH - HYDROTHERAPY

This is so that the vet makes us aware of anything that might be affected by the dog swimming,

such as diabetes which means the dog has to follow a strict feeding and exercise routine which swimming could interfere with.

I know your facility is a serious place but do you have a funny story to share?

Yes it is a serious place, however, we want every dog/cat/ animal to really enjoy the experience and have fun.

If they are having fun they often don't realise that they are also working and doing something that helps them.
Also if the dog is happy so is the owner.

We have lots of funny incidents and the dogs often make us laugh and smile.

For example:

Bob who decided that he was a parrot and climbed on my shoulder.

Stanley who loves the chew stick so much that when I stood in the middle of the pool with it he just kept swimming round and round me.

Reg used to jump into the pool over the side, swim 2 circuits of the pool and then lay on the ramp just enjoying the warm water looking at us as if to say "what? I have done my bit!"

But often the funniest moments are when the dogs get things wrong like anticipating a toy being thrown and start to jump, try and stop themselves before falling head first into the water.

We laugh with them not at them and make sure they never come to any harm if this happens.

Indy one of our GSDs used to like standing on the ramp between swims and having a certain set of balls thrown to him.

These balls could be filled with water and on catching them Indy would take great pleasure in squeezing the balls of that a jet of water came out which he would aim at either me or his owners, soaking them often in the face!

Indy would play this game for ages and would probably have stayed all day playing it.
The balls however, have now too many holes in them to be used like this anymore and unfortunately we are unable to get anymore.

Is there anything else that you feel is important everyone knows about that I never knew to ask you?

Just to let owners know that swimming is one of the best forms of exercise for dogs and has many benefits.

It is especially good for puppies while they are growing and their delicate bones and joints are still forming and can be easily damaged.

Also by getting a puppy used to swimming early, if it should ever need it for an injury it will enjoy it much quicker.

Why not have a go at hydrotherapy yourself - you might surprise yourself and really enjoy it just like Kit.





INTERVIEW WITH KITT

Tell me about yourself?

My name is Kitt I'm a Purcher, which means my Dad was a pointer and Mum was a lurcher.

I'm 8 years old but behave like a puppy.

I'm an Accrington lass, from Lancashire and my owners brought me to the other side of the Pennines and I'm happily living in Derbyshire now.
I was called Kitt because when I arrived at 8 weeks there were 5 cats in the house, I used to be able to come in and out of their cat flap and they only spat if I got too close. My favourite things to do are swimming, running in forests and on beaches.

Do you work? Where and if so what do you do?

Lifeguard but there's not much demand.

I could be a settee tester or an antler bone assessor as I spend a lot of time practicing. I enjoy chasing things and swimming.

I have mild hip dysplasia which means I try to swim more than run in the woods as its better for my joints. however I can't resist chasing a hare.

What is your favorite food?

I eat raw meat and when my owners aren't looking cat food. I'm keen to eat most things and do if I'm not stopped.

Where is your favourite place to be?

I like the seaside, on the beach

walking between Whitby and Sandsends.

I also like to go to hydrotherapy at Chesterfield Hydrotherapy Referral Centre, I get cuddles and treats and play ball in the pool – fabulous.

Then I get dried off and cuddled more – finally more treats – its hard to beat.

It's good for me and better than the gym.

What is your favourite way to entertain yourself (annoy humans)?

I like to lie in muddy puddles when I get a hot tummy from running.

My owners yell at me "No' but I can't help myself.

I'm also quite partial to rolling in fox poo!

What is your greatest accomplishment?

Walking off the lead without getting sidetracked when I see people, joggers, cyclists and animals.

I'm aware that 'my public want to cuddle me so tend to run right up to them.

What is your next goal in life? I love going to hydrotherapy

every week to be looked after and play ball in the pool. I'd like my owners to be home more and for the cats to show me more respect.

If you could be/do anything for a day, what would it be? I'd make sure every dog as a numby learnt to swim and to

puppy learnt to swim and to not be afraid of water.

What was your human's most embarrassing moment?

She fell over on a walk with me and we ended up getting an ambulance – I rode home in someone's car.

Once she got home it was funny, she was hobbling around for ages...
