THE #GREAT DOG WALK TOGETHER



Saturday 23 June at 11am

What is the event all about?

The aim of the #GreatDogWalkTogether is to encourage people to arrange a community walk, invite everyone to join in, with or without a dog, and enjoy the company of others to promote wellbeing.

When is it taking place?

It will take place across the UK on Saturday 23 June 2018 at 11am. We've already stated a time in order to make it as easy as possible to arrange a walk. All you have to do is decide where to meet up

Why are you organising it?

This event will support the Great Get Together initiative, which was set up by the Jo Cox Commission.

Their study into loneliness wants to encourage people within their community to get together and celebrate what they have in common. Jo Cox

was quoted as saying "Let's enjoy having more in common than that which divides us" It's a great opportunity to meet new people and make new contacts.

Who's it for?

It's for anyone and everyone. You don't need a dog to take part but having dogs on the walk means that it is so much easier to strike up a conversation with a four legged friend and their owner

Where are the walks taking place?

Anywhere across the UK it's up to you where you wish to walk. We are encouraging anyone to arrange a walk.

These walks can involve small groups meeting locally for a short walk around their neighbourhood streets or a longer walk in a nearby park or surrounding countryside. It doesn't need to be a large gathering.

All you need to decide is where you will meet up and invite others to join in

What do I have to do to take part?

It's simply, all you need to do is decide where you want to

walk and invite others to take part.

We will provide an information factsheet with suggestions as to how you can promote your walk.

We will also provide an A4 poster, which you can download and put up around your community

I didn't know who Santa was but then he crashed in our garden and I met him and he is luffly. He has lots of treats in his pockets and helped us run so fast that we fly.



What is A Greyt Christmas Tail about?

A Greyt Christmas Tail is set on Christmas Eve. When Santa's sleigh crashes in their back garden, rescue dogs Ramsey and Blue jump into action. Volunteering to pull the sleigh, they help Santa meet his deadline and deliver presents around the world – all before their hoomans wake up.

She gets very scareded and runs around the house so I has to be a big boy and make her feel better. Wees usually finds a soft corner to cuddle in and muvver ties a scarfy thing around her. I try to give her my braveness so she isn't scareded anymore and that's what this adventure is about.

spread all my toes out in protest. It gets worse.


The inky stuff didn't come off! Farver washed my foot so much but it was still purple so then I had to wear a sock as muvver didn't want purple pawses on the carpet.

TIGGER INVESTIGATES... SAVIOURS HAVEN SANCTUARY

I Contacted Saviours Haven Sanctuary to find out more about them.

Harpo and Zante were available and happy to answer my questions.

What is the history of Saviours Haven Sanctuary?

Zante: Well if we go waaaay back to the beginning, it all started with our human, Steve, who was previously a child actor and worked in pantomime, performed a comedy entertainment act. It wasn't called Saviours Haven Sanctuary then.

life with us.


We would have an education centre for visitors to learn about the resident animals and why they should never be kept as pets.





I was not sure what to expect but it was a very entertaining and educational show. It not only lets humans see animals they would not normally get to see, but it contained educational information as to why they should not be kept as pets.

I asked the animals that were in the show how they felt about being in the show.

Harpo: I am the star! The show

would be nothing without my star appearance.

Flower and Timone the meerkats: we love cuddles with our humans on stage but we clearly show the audience our contempt for them with our super terrifying meerkat stare.

Sonny the common corn snake: Ssssssuper , I love it.

Diamond the barn owl: I love showing off my beautiful feathers.

Freddie the chocolate striped skunk: I love going to the

shows as I love getting cuddles and kisses.

Zante: As the real star of the show I love the attention. As each of us are not on stage for very long we find it not stressful at all.

Also when our humans get us out of our travel accommodation, if any of us don't feel up to stardom during a show we are put straight back into our accommodation.

That is what we love about our humans, they put us and our needs first.

ANIMALS WITH CAREERS - JESSIE

Tell me a bit about yourself:

My name is Russelena Jessie - Jessie to my friends and family, I am 4 on 26 March & lived with my hoo & 2 catfurbros Alan & Tommy for almost 2 years (they are in charge).

I am half sisfur of Lennie the Loon & girlfriend of Sir Bolly Bark-a-Lot. I came via Sheffield GT at Wortley.

How did you become a blood donor?

I first gave blood 1 month after arriving at my furever home as they do it at Sheffield GT.

The Greyhounds who need homes are all mostly donors there as the Pet Blood Bank like to have our blood due to our excellent quality juice cos we are so fit! Sprat (my Mum can't give red juice so she said I could do it for us both! She is very proud of us all

What does it involve?

We first get a free health check MOT off the lovely vet to make sure we are healthy & have no problems.

We get a small bit of neck fur shaved off & a sample taken to see if we have good blood & no nasties in it.

We also have our teefs checked, eyes, ears, tummy, heart & a general top to tail & toe check. If we are good to donate we then get taken to a

special area where we have lots of cuddles & support.

Someone lifts us on a comfy bed & snuggles us all the time - which I love!

They then pop a cannula pointy needle in our neck & fill a bag up with our blood. Often 750g so I am told.

Takes about 30-45 minutes the whole start to finish. When we have filled the bag they take my pulse so it drops to normal level they redress me (yes I do it naked)!

Then the best bit - food & treats & a free toy, plus goodie bag of bandanas, stickers, shopping bags, & Fish4Dogs salmon treats - well worth it for the goodies!

Oh on my 5th donation I got a special lead as I saved 20 dogs! A bag of our blood can save up to 4 dogs!

Do you need to do anything special to stay a blood donor?

We get weighed as we have to weigh no less than 25 or 26 kg. I usually stick about 27.5kg. I can't travel abroad due to diseases in other countries & I can't be on long term medication. Other than that I just go every 3 or 4 times a year. I always have 'excellent' on my reports. Last time round they said I was the perfect example

of how a donor should be - proud pointy is !!!!!

Do you have any funny or embarrassing stories about giving blood?

Sadly no but I am sure there are plenty of times to come to have some as I won't retire until maybe 9 years old as we can keep going for years .

I love donating to help my 4 & sometimes 3 legged pals. You never know when you may need a bit of my blood.

Sign up it's a great cause to support. Pet Blood Bank are a wonderful charity & love us all.

All breeds can donate as far as I know just gotta be the 25kg over weight. I would encourage any fural to sign up to help our pawpals out there.



A NICE WALK ON THE BEACH

As the weather warms up it is nice to go to the beach for a walk with your humans.

There are things you need to be careful of when walking on the beach.

Sand:

Yes sand feels nice on your paws but get your human to make sure the sand is not too hot for you to walk on. Also there is the risk of objects that are hidden in the sand which may be poisonous or cause injury to you.

Where there is sand there is a risk of quicksand. Quicksand is caused by a hole filled up with loose sand and water which makes a gloopy mess that is very hard to walk through or get out of. Also, depending on the size of the hole, you or your human may find yourself stuck or submerged.

Water:

Always take care when in the sea as the tide is always changing and may pull you out to sea.

Drinking sea water is not good for you either as there is a high level of salt which can make you very sick.

Sun:

Yes I know in the UK this can be a rare event BOL! Humans do not realise that we can get sunburnt and suffer heatstroke too. So your hu-

mans need to keep an eye on you.

Seaweed:

Seaweed is in abundance on most beaches but you need to take care with seaweed that is dried out. If you eat any it can expand inside you and cause a lot of damage or in some cases death.

Dead fish (and other dead things on the shoreline):

Apart from grossing your humans out by sniffing then rolling in something dead and stinky on the beach, you need to avoid going near anything like this. The dead critter may have died from disease, but even if it didn't it will now be jumping with bacteria and other nasty germs that can make you ill.

Jellyfish:

Some jellyfish are poisonous and can make us very ill. Even non poisonous jellyfish can cause problems as we may be allergic to them.

Palm Oil:

This can appear on beaches as white or grey jelly type or solid lumps, sometimes mistaken for washed up polystyrene. These must be totally avoided as they are waste product and some humans had the bright idea of getting rid of it by dumping it out at sea. After being dumped out at sea it travels the tides picking up a

vast amount of nasty bacteria.

Seals:

Seals naturally get out of the water and have a rest on the shoreline. Normally they do it at times when there are not a lot of humans or dogs around.

They can be aggressive if they are disturbed and even more so if they have their young with them.

Keep away from the seals.

If your human is worried that the seal may be injured, tell them not to approach them and contact a local wildlife or marine expert.

Other dogs:

Not all dogs get on with each other and not all dogs are allowed to run off lead on the beach.

If you came across another off lead dog make sure you listen to your humans if they call you away from that dog.

Never approach a dog that is on lead if you are off lead.

Humans:

If there are humans sitting on the beach don't rush up to them as not everyone wants a soggy, sand covered slobbery cuddle from you.

Also avoid helping yourself to their picnics.

Keep well away from humans that are fishing as they have hooks, line, lead weights and other things that are harmful to you.




