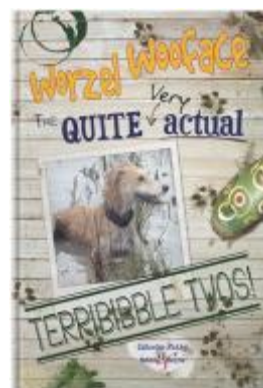

HINTS AND TIPS - SECURING A LEAD IN THE CAR

The age old question of how to secure us by our lead in a car usually results in two outcomes.

1. there is a lot of wrestling while unclipping the lead from us to secure it to the car with only one hand and re-clipping us onto the lead again.

2. A quick break for freedom, which could result in a lot of 'catch me if you can' or even worse running off completely or getting injured

After many wrestling matches or comedy chases and sometimes both at the same time, my human devised a way to secure my lead to the car without having to unclip me.

Now I need to add some safety advice here.

I do not jump around the car like a dog possessed and my human uses a harness on me.

My collar is used purely to display my identification tags.

This advice is for the calm dog that prefers to sleep or lie down during car trips.

If you are the type of dog that likes to jump around and create all levels of chaos in the

car, your human will have to look at other ways to ensure you are safely secured in the car.

Step one:

We need to get into the car. Personally I prefer to sit in the boot - it is an estate car.

Step two:

Push the mid part of the lead through the anchoring point in the car. You can adjust where on the lead to either give us more or less lead.

- with practice this can be done one handed if your human needs to keep hold of you to prevent you jumping out again



Step 3:

Push the handle through the loop that has now been formed pull (from the end connected to us to tighten the loop around the handle.



Step 4:

Double check we have enough lead to ensure we are comfortable during the car trip.

Step 5:

Close boot

Once you reach your destination it is an easy one handed action to untie the lead.

Step A:

Pull the lead handle back out of the loop.

- Your human can use their spare hand to hold on to you if needed.

Step B:

Still holding the handle of the lead pull the loop back out of the anchoring point.

With practice this can be done quite quickly and at no point is there any need to take the lead off us.

HEALTH - EARS

There are many types of dog ears due to the shape and size.

In my opinion there are only 4 really different types of dog's ears and the rest are all varieties of these four.

First is the sticky up ears like huskies, Chihuahua and Alsatians.

These ears are always stuck up like the dog is on constant listening mode.

Second are the hangy down ears like beagles, bloodhounds and basset hounds.

I am not sure what the purpose of having ears like this are for.

The only evidence I have seen is their use as a food collector while eating or absorbent sponge during drinking with the sole purpose of maximising the food/water splatter radius while shaking.

The third are the half n half ears that start off going straight up, then giving up half way and flopping over. These ears seem to be a firm favourite for the humans which give rise to lots of gibberish and cooing noises from them.

The fourths are greyhound and lurcher ears.

They do not fit into one category as they are the gymnastic Olympians of dog ears and have a full range of semaphore capabilities.

Ear care is very important and your human should check them regularly to make sure they are kept clean and clear from dirt and parasites.

Any redness, unusual smells, discharge, shaking of the head or furious scratching of the

ears may be a sign something is wrong.

If you suspect any of these symptoms get your human to check your ears and get advice from your vet.

Your ears should be checked regularly.

Most humans do this when they groom us or in the evenings when we are snuggled up with them on the sofa chilling out.

When your humans are cleaning your ears they should only use small bits of damp cotton wool, starting from the centre and wiping toward the edges of our ears.

It must be pointed out here that the cotton wool should not be dripping wet as a sudden drip into our ears will result in us jumping up and shaking our heads vigorously. This will also make us more reluctant to ear cleaning the next time.

Each bit of cotton wool should only be used once.

Any foreign objects or lots of dirt inside our ears must be removed carefully so that it is not pushed further down into our ear. If the object or dirt is deep into our ear then assistance from a vet may be required.
