

TESS IN THE KITCHEN

Sadly, my big brother Fred, went to sleep on Saturday 10th April. He had a stroke overnight and with his arthritis and wobbling, the vet and Mum and Dad agreed it was time for Fred to go to sleep.

Fred and me had planned this recipe last month and when Mum got some new fancy Bundt tins we thought we would steal them and use them (surely that is why Mum got them?!). Mum and Dad said as part of the ingredients I should mention that several scented candles are needed as the cake stinks the house. Personally, I thought the smell was wonderful!

Sardine Bundt Cake

Ingredients:

270g (three tins drained) sardines
 270g plain flour
 2 medium eggs
 100ml milk
 4 brand spanking new small Bundt tins (BOL!)

Method:

1 Preheat oven to 180 degrees fan. Lightly oil the Bundt tins.

2 Drain the sardines (watch Mum retch at the smell! Bol!) and mix all the ingredients together until well mixed.

3 Spoon the mixture into the Bundt tins until you reach the top of the centre.

4 Bake for 25 - 30 minutes until a skewer inserted into the middle of one of the cakes comes out clean.

5 Leave to cool completely in the tin.


Storage:

Store in an airtight container for a week or wrap the cakes individually and freeze them.

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


Well fellow doggies, today is what the oomans call a Bank Holiday but I think it is a Bark Holiday!

This is a rigid rubber toy with several prongs with different surface shapes.

It is bright yellow, although I believe it can be in different colours.

Fred was an adopted Springer Spaniel from Springer Rescue for Scotland and lived with his mum, dad and fursister Tess, a Cocker Spaniel. Fred affectionately referred to Tess as a Diva, a Minx or Ninja Tess because of her extraordinary skill in stealing food from the most impossible-to-reach places.

We first 'got to know' Fred 5-6 years ago when we started following him on Facebook and gradually built up a friendship with him. His daily posts were the highlight of our day; most were funny, revealing his day to day antics and shenanigans. Although I never got to meet Fred in pawson, my late fur-brothers Fergus and Monty had that pleasure and I did get to meet Tess once in Warkworth... more on that



later.

Fred liked to be 'helpful' around his home and garden and kept the latter tidy by 'clearing away' stones and plants before bringing them into the house to show his mum his 'good work'.

Fred the Shred as he was sometimes called was skilled at, you guessed it....shredding, BOL! Junk mail (in fact all mail), toilet roll, his mum's knitting patterns, slippers and anything else worthy of his attention all succumbed to his finely honed skills. Tess's toys, too, often suffered the same fate and had to be kept out of reach. Fred would always deny being responsible and we all thought that the culprit was most likely a pawltergeist. BOL!

He often made fun of his mum's handmade creations which she brought home from Arts & Crafts classes and he would always refer to the display of them as "the shelves of shame". BOL!

His mum knits and crochets and once made him a Pom-Pom coat which he unwillingly modelled. The look of shame on his face was amusing to say the least and poor Fred when speaking of his ordeal said "How ridiculous! I feel totally embarrassed and humiliated. It was in the Mason's Arms that I at last got to meet Tess and her mum, although Tess and I just sat and ignored each other all afternoon whilst our hoomans had a drink and a blether.

Like all spanners Fred enjoyed his food and would often mention what had been on the menu that day such as fried eggs, bacon, sausages, ninny-nannas, yiggy-yoggy-yoo, liver cake, pompydoms, sardines.....the list was endless. Fred celebrated his 6th Gotcha Day in January with a feast fit for a king.

And speaking of kings, Fred even had his own castle; Warkworth Castle and he came to be known as Sir Fred of Warkworth and Tess as Lady Tess Dubois. He kindly named two of its towers Fergus Tower and Montague Tower after my late furbrothers and the other two towers after Sparky and myself. My dad often drives his train past Warkworth and would reassure Fred that his castle was being well looked after in his absence or staff were busy getting it ready for his next visit, BOL.

Fred's posts were truly memorable and Facebook hasn't been the same without him. Here are just a few of my pawsonal favourites:

When Fred had watched a family member on tv compete on University Challenge, he subsequently tried getting a team together to enter "Dogiversity Challenge" but it was a photo of him with his nameplate underneath him that really stuck with us. My mum still has a chuckle when thinking about that one.

In a more recent post a completely innocent photo of Fred looking through a doorway gave us quite a 'fright' as we thought it resembled the famous Jack Nicholson scene from The Shining. Fred

looked like he was about to say "Here's Freddy".

And finally, on St David's Day, Fred was pictured with a leek and wished his followers "Happy St Dad's Day". Poor Fred was confused because his dad is called David.

Thank you Fred for sharing your adventures with us over the years. We always enjoyed reading them and 'chatting' to you. You were a part of our lives for nearly six years and I'm sure I speak for all of your followers when saying this, but it really did feel like we were getting to know you, Tess and your mum and dad. You will be greatly missed.

Thank you, too, for being our friend.

TIGGER'S GREEN PAW - IN THE GARDEN

As with all plants, always check if you have any health problems that may be affected by growing any plants in your garden or yard.

Green Beans

Animal Safety: **Dogs:** Yes **Cats:** yes **Rabbits:** with care

Free Grazing: No

Lifespan: Vegetable planted as needed

Sow: April to May, after the frost

Harvest: August to September

Soil Type: warm, sunny spot in fertile, well-drained soil.

Position: Likes the full sun

Growth: depending on variety planted. Around 4 inches long

Varieties: Several hundred



How to use:

Free grazing:

Dogs: Safe for free grazing for dogs in moderation.

Cats: Could cause a bit of upset tummy as cats do not have the enzymes required to eat vegetation

Rabbits: rabbits don't naturally eat root vegetables, but access in moderation if they start snacking on growing carrot leaves

Raw:

Dogs: Care should be taken in feeding raw as green beans contain lechitin proteins, which can be toxic in large quantities and cause tummy upset in smaller quantities.

Cats: Cats should not be fed raw green beans as they contain contain lechitin proteins, which cats cannot process effectively and can be toxic and cause tummy upset.

Rabbits: Even though rabbits can process lots of green vegetables, too many green beans can cause bloating and tummy upset.

Cooked:

Dogs: Can be added whole, sliced or chopped into food in moderation.

Cats: Small amounts can be added to food.

Rabbits: Not safe to be fed cooked vegetables.

Storage:

Fresh green beans can be stored in an air tight container in a fridge up to 7 days.

Cooked green beans can be stored in an air tight container in a fridge for 2 to 3 days.

Green beans can be frozen for several months if you cut the ends off and blanch them.

Martingale Collars:

An fur the luckie black hounds go all out, I am talking diamonds, crystals, Day glow coloursthat your hoomans will remember from the 80's (Step away from the leg warmers Muvva)

Now an important fing here, If you are doing Blingy Blingy keep your base colour plain otherwise everything will clash.

If you are going bright base colour choose a darker detail, I have seen sum gorgeous leather fishtail collars in bright leather that have some dark stitching details which stands out beautifully

Full brindle hounds – STEP AWAY FROM THE AUTUMN COLOURS, dey will blend in better than bear grylls in a bush tucker trial... Find a good solid base colour! finds a Tango shade of orange is best then work from there, usually I pair with either dark crystals or stitch detail and add a few low light patterns

If you are a brindle like me own hansum self, or a moo moo, fink abouts were you collars are sitting, is it on a white bit or coloured bit? Brindles... Spots and Stripes do work, I haff a very fetching fishtail collar with a stunning leopard print on it, use a contrasting leather collar to add a bit of pahzazz to your wardrobe

Lets talk material, Collars need to be robust and functional but that doesn't mean boorrriinnnggg there are a multitude of styles available to the furshion focused hound, You can find collars in Cotton, Velvet, Satin, Tweed, leather, suedeor even plain webbing.

If you are a fleffer, a leather collar would be best then you don't stick your toe through the material and rips it, scratches on leather can be buffed out with a bit of saddle soap...

You will find that martingales are lined with either cotton or

satin to stops the collar rubbing nekky patches on your neck, Fishtails can be plain, padded or lined, I do like a sheepie skin lined fishtail which is paired with a sooper smart tweed on the front, perfect for either the Hound About Town or Country Gent.

For the city hounds we need something that is sooper smart for day wear but works perfectly for boys night on the town, There is some stunning patterned material that will take you from day to night seamlessly.

The internet is your best friend, look up those who inspire you and create your look from there, Use them as an idea's base, I have used celebrities looks as a base and added my own floydie flair to dem to make them unique and my own.

The most important fing to remember houndie friends, is have fun, play with different styles and don't be afraid to stand out from the crowd.





A classic Norman motte and bailey castle, founded soon after the Conquest to overawe the Saxon town. A later stone shell-keep crowns its steep mound, giving sweeping views across the town rooftops to the River Dart.

Climb to the top of the keep to enjoy stunning views over the town of Totnes and across to the River Dart. Or enjoy a picnic in the peaceful grounds under the shelter of age old trees - there is plenty of space for families to relax on a summers day. Within easy walking distance of the town,

the castle is an ideal addition to any day out in South Devon and you can combine the visit with one to nearby Dartmouth and Berry Pomeroy Castles which are just a short drive away.

Parking:

Limited Pay and Display parking (64 metres away), suitable for cars only. Not managed by English Heritage. From Station Road, turn South onto Castle Street, signposted 'Historic Town Centre'. After approximately 200m, turn left onto North Street, signposted 'North Street for Historic Town Centre'. Easy route from main town car parks to site.


Inner Bailey is accessible
