





First of all I was shocked and surprised, my human was horrified, to find out there is a pawsome and very loud squeaker in the head of the snake.


Personal Observations:

WAG AND COMPANY

Wag and Company have just launched a new partnership with Northumbria Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust to enable more elderly dog lovers, in their own homes in Northumberland, to continue to enjoy the friendship of a dog and obviously to help combat loneliness at the same time.

The new partnership is supported by the Trust's Bright Northumbria charity.

With up to 12,000 older people in Northumberland currently estimated to feel lonely often or always, Wag and Company hope that their work with the Trust will not only bring joy to those we visit but will also have a positive impact on their health.

Wag and Company already home visit on referral from a small number of professional organisations across the North East region but on a relatively small scale; this is the first time they have teamed up with an NHS trust.

Home visiting is a simple idea but ensuring everyone's safety is obviously of paramount importance.

That's where the partnership comes in.

The support workers from the Healthcare Trust in this case, already visit many isolated people in their own homes, and are best placed to know how

beneficial the visits would be and then to risk assess the whole situation and refer to Wag and Company using their online Home Visit Referral Form.

About Wag and Company:

Wag and Company enable professionally assessed volunteers and their dogs to visit older dog lovers in their own homes or in care and medical establishments across the North East of England.

The organisation was founded by local business people and is supported by some key businesses in the North East.

Having visited the elderly with dogs in nursing homes as part of corporate volunteering programmes, they have seen first hand the positive benefits of new friends and the special bond between dogs and people.

The scale of the loneliness issue amongst pensioners is significant.

There are more than **51,000** pensioners in the North East who describe themselves as lonely all or most of the time.

The North East is also a region of dog lovers, having, at **36%**, the highest percentage of dog owning households in the UK.

Until now, no visiting dog organisation in the North East enabled volunteers with dogs

to visit people in their own homes, only in care or medical establishments.

Wag & Company reaches older dog lovers who miss the friendship of a dog wherever they are in our region.

Home visiting takes a special person and dog. Can you find an hour a week or a fortnight to be a friend to a lonely neighbour?
