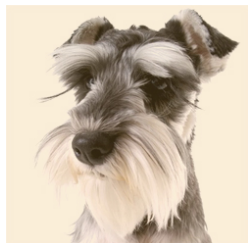

A vet, Fiona Macdonald who specialises in developing and supplying fish medicine, thinks she may have found a possible cause.

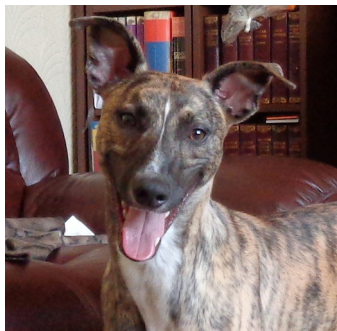
Along with a friend who is a microbiologist, they are looking at a bacteria *Aeromonas Hydrophilia* which infects the skin. Then the resulting infection travels to the kidneys.

This is very much still in theory and a lot more data from dogs affected by Alabama Rot.

Yep you hear correctly pal, special purpose built duche de doggies.

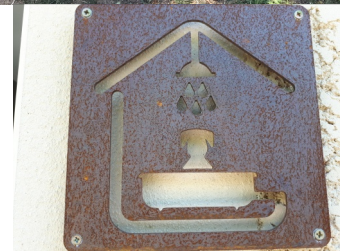
I've witnessed first paw the humiliation of furry friends being hosed in broad daylight. I myself have suffered public

On a small back lane a cocker spaniel sent Fred into frenzy, Fred managed to get out of his muzzle and 2 collars and caught the other dog's ear. The cocker was ok, needed to go to a vet but Maggie and Chris sorted everything with his owner.

I thought that was it, they will for sure send us both back, I was very stressed but they said that we are not going anywhere! Freddie and Maggie hit the lessons and private classes hard, it wasn't easy as Fred is such a big and strong dog but things are looking much better.

At home we are just so soft, our humans still can't believe how laid back we are. They love us A LOT, we have loads of toys and beds everywhere. We sleep in their bedroom, we have our own comfy cushions but they don't mind if we get on their bed and Fred just loves it.

I have 3 cardigans and 1 rain proof mac and I look amazing in all of them. We have our own room for when they go to work with 4 VERY comfy beds and yet me and Fred still manage to get into a little spat over who sleeps where.

We also have 2 friendly cockatiels, just like us they are also rescues. They don't mind us

too much as long as we don't bother them.

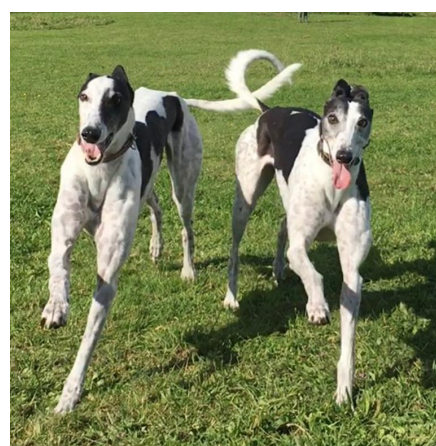
Maggie and Chris take us with them on holidays, we've been to Scotland a few times, Wales and Dartmoor.

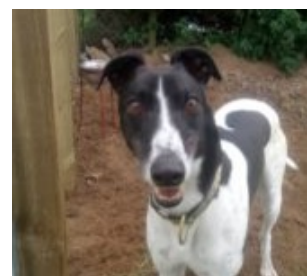

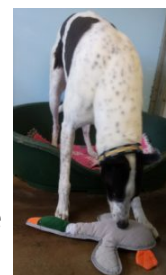

DOG FRIENDLY BOUTIQUE OPENING SOON

Safe Homes and Kindness (SHAK) are a registered charity; that have been saving dogs since 19th June 2006.

They are not the normal animal rescue centre that finds homes for abandoned dogs.

SHAK goes that one step further and has created a sanctuary for those dogs abused and neglected to the point they have found themselves on death row with next to no chance from anyone.

Unlike a rescue centres where the goal is to get dogs to their forever homes.

SHAK give sanctuary to dogs that need the specialist time and dedication for them to recover and live out the rest of their lives in a loving and secure environment.

Although a lot of these dogs will never be allowed to be re-

homed they will still experience love, playtimes and eventually cuddles from the special humans that have dedicated their lives to these dogs.

As a sanctuary there is no quick adoptions to free up kennel space, yet more dogs do end up needing SHAK's specialist care.

With around 70 dogs to care for until their natural time to cross the Rainbow Bridge financing their needs is a constant challenge.

Unlike a lot of dogs going to rescue centres a lot of these dogs have physical damage along with the emotional damage.

So vet bills start mounting up from the moment the dogs arrive.

Recently at SHAK HQ in Greenwell Road, Alnwick they held a

pop up boutique with items donated to them from the caring public they were able to raise much needed funds.

So after that success they have worked hard behind the scenes and they are now able to open the boutique as a permanent feature.

The grand opening will be soon, but as your ever vigilant newshound I will tell you all as soon as I find out.

To start with it will be open on Wednesday 10am to 3pm and Saturday 10am to 3pm with hopes of eventually being open all week in the future.

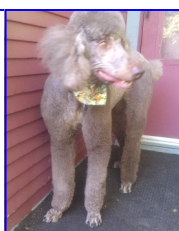

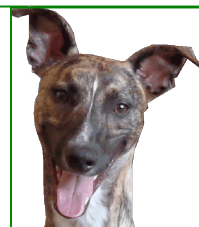

Small car park located nearby (about 600m). Access to the car park is down narrow lanes unsuitable for large coaches.

Facilities:

None on location

Notes:

The track to the village is over farmland where cattle regularly graze and can be extremely muddy in wet weather. At least two stiles have to be crossed on this route.

There is a partially hidden, sheer drop into the passageway into the fogou. The site is very remote and exposed, with no shelter in extreme weather conditions.

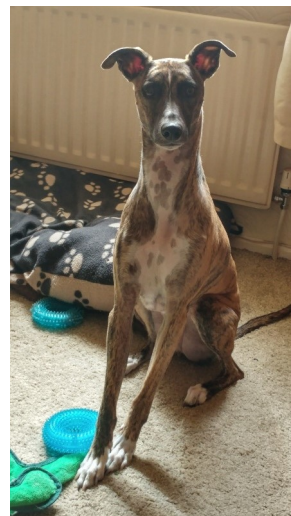
